Marylin/ Alisa

- o Very focused on homelessness issue
  - BCC issued a policy, and they are accepting comments on their website homepage
  - Speakers addressed obstacles with getting funding (if program related to sobriety, often times tied to religion and separation of church/ state becomes issue)
  - City has a 'housing first' policy and won't give funding if there are restrictions implemented by the nonprofit (like sobriety)
  - Currently, approximately 39 people live on San Vicente. 11 had refused all services. 10 had vouchers but refused housing. Our population is different than that in other areas so Los Angeles statistics don't always address our population.
  - City of Thousand Oaks doesn't allow their homeless population to store items or camp permanently in public

places. They are allowed to sleep and congregate in designated areas at night but must vacate the area during the day.

- o Extensive group discussion
  - Bonin Motion to allow beach parking lots and parks for homeless housing, camping and safe parking
    - BCC opposes
  - What are the actual solutions?
  - Pieces published in the LA times
