Treasurer (Melissa)

- Melissa mentioned that we stay with our current voicemail/ Segway plan, and consider other options as the new financial year approaches
- We will be renewing GoDaddy subscription for next year

## BCC Meeting (Sheila)

The following topics were discussed at the BCC meeting held on 6/8/22 :

- Janet Turner announced that the House passed a sweeping package, largely along party lines -- called the "Protect Our Kids Act" -- which would raise the age limit for purchasing semi-automatic rifles from 18 to 21, ban high-capacity magazines, create firearm safe storage requirements, and tighten the regulation of bump stocks and "ghost guns"
- Ms Turner also talked about the America Competes Act, which is designed to create and maintain jobs in America
- LAPD West LA Division Captain Jonathan Tom presented a crime comparison of the LAPD to NYPD and Chicago PD, in the form of a power point presentation including maps of the cities by bureaus and charts
- Hillside burglaries are on the rise
- Captain John recommended putting 3M film over glass doors to prevent breakage
- Flock cameras taking photos of license plates, sound good in theory, but they take a lot of manpower to match license plate with vehicle
- Carlos Luna Diaz, new Barrington Rec Center Director, is starting a summer basketball league. Please contact him at barrington.recreationcenter@lacity.org or carlos.luna.diaz@lacity.org (see attachment).
- Bureau of Street Services, Assistant Director Shirley Lau, and Project Director Lance Oishi, discussed the impact of real-time bus schedule; digital panels will be moderate and cell data collected will be limited and will not violate rider privacy; locations of panels have not been

determined

• The BCC suggested that we draft correspondence to LA Metro in response to LA Metro's I-405 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan, as they want comments from the community to provide input on these priority projects

### **CRIME AND SAFTY** (Pam B.)

- Detective Hall, specializing in burglary, spoke at the BCC meeting held on 6/8/22
- Suggestions included the window film and other measures to make break ins harder and ensuring the locking of all windows, including second floor windows and doors
- Specific incidents were mentioned, including one at a Darlington apartment building where the manager interfered with the robbery, window smashing and burglaries on Saltair, Wilshire and San Vicente and a grand theft auto on Darlington
- It was noted that some criminals know how to get into security systems to delete photo evidence
- Armen suggested that we ask Police for a walk and bike patrol in Brentwood while the LAPD are elemented to the second seco
- and participating in the Ready Your
  LA Neighborhood (RYLAN) program, which was developed to help your family and your
  neighborhood prepare for severe emergencies and disasters
