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SBRA'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING 2023 AND PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

SBRA represents over 18,000 people, including all residents in multi-family buildings anywhere in Brentwood and all residents of single-family homes in South Brentwood.

SBRA was very busy last year accomplishing great things for our diverse community. Here are just a few of our achievements:

- Held a forum among the candidates for LA County Supervisor and LA City Council so that our members could decide who to vote for in last year's important local elections.
- Continued to advocate for an increase in housing and resources for homeless vets at the West LA Veterans Administration ("VA") and to insist that the homeless population on San Vicente and elsewhere in Brentwood be transferred to housing on the VA campus or other supportive housing.
- Met with our newly elected local governmental officials and/or their staff, including U.S. Congressman Brad Sherman, State Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin, L.A. County Supervisor Lindsey Horvath and L.A. City Councilwoman Traci Park to introduce SBRA and explain the issues facing South Brentwood.
- Provided comments on real estate developments and the opening of new businesses in South Brentwood to minimize the impact of such development and businesses to the surrounding neighborhood. For example, SBRA wrote a letter in favor of demolishing the Barry Building on San Vicente in order to remove an unsafe structure and facilitate the property's future redevelopment in a manner which will enhance the community.

- Served as an interface between South Brentwood and the West LAPD on crime and safety issues, including attending regular meetings with representatives from the West LAPD and communicating with Senior Lead Officer Matt Kirk regarding incidents of crime in South Brentwood.
- Advocated for improvements to Barrington Park and Recreation Center. During 2023, SBRA co-sponsored an Earth Day celebration at Barrington Recreation Center.
- Co-sponsored clean-up days in South Brentwood with Volunteers Cleaning

Communities to clean-up trash and litter on the streets in South Brentwood.

• Took positions on legislation and ordinances which are of interest to the Brentwood community. For example, SBRA joined a number of other neighborhood associations across Los Angeles to ask that Mayor Karen Bass set aside funding in the City budget to enforce the current Home Sharing Ordinance to prevent illegal short-term rentals.

SBRA will continue working on these tasks and has plans for additional new projects to keep South Brentwood a great place to live and work! SBRA welcomes your input and assistance with these efforts.

Hydee Feldstein Soto Los Angeles City Attorney

Hydee Feldstein Soto is the 43rd Los Angeles City Attorney, the first female City Attorney in L.A. history, and the first Latina elected citywide. Leading a team of nearly 1,000 legal professionals, including 500+ attorneys, she is the City's general

counsel and serves as legal advisor to the Mayor, City Council, and to the City's boards and departments. Feldstein Soto also oversees the prosecution of misdemeanors and the administration of criminal justice.

Born and raised in San Juan Puerto Rico, Feldstein Soto has called Los Angeles home for more than 40 years after graduating from Swarthmore College and obtaining her law degree from Columbia University. She built her career as a partner in private practice at large international law firms garnering a reputation for leadership and problem solving before entering politics to use these skills to address homelessness, protecting communities and the vulnerable plus transparency, accountability and corruption in government.



Lindsey HorvathL.A. County Supervisor,
3rd District

Before becoming the youngest woman ever to be elected to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Lindsey Horvath was the Mayor of West Hollywood. She now represents the 3rd District, an area of 446 square miles that includes

portions of the San Fernando Valley and all of the Westside. With a population of 2 million residents, it would be the 5th largest city in the U.S after Houston.

As the newest Supervisor, Horvath has tremendous executive power, joining her four colleagues in awarding contracts, hiring and firing department leaders, and crafting the county's more than \$40-billion budget, much of which comes from federal and state government funding. She also has legislative power, with the ability to pass laws — as long as she has the support of at least two colleagues, giving her the unique ability to not just come up with new legislation or initiatives, but actually see it across the finish line.

The first thing she did after she took office was to issue a proclamation stating that homelessness in Los Angeles County was a local emergency and since that time she has been working diligently to address this issue which has become a focal point for the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. As an issue of great importance to our neighborhood, we look forward to her insights and comments at the upcoming SBRA Annual General Meeting on October 19, 2023.



Matthew Kirk
Senior Lead Officer,
West Los Angeles LAPD

SLO Matt Kirk joined the LAPD academy in August of 2000, and upon completing his academy work he transferred to the Van Nuys division for a few years. He began his time the in West LA division in February of 2002, working patrol until 2004 when he

decided to be a bike patrol officer. (This was a great job which kept him in shape!) He spent about a year in the WLA gang unit before deciding that he liked the bike unit more and returned to that detail.

In 2006 Kirk was promoted to a field training officer working with new recruits right out of the academy. He became a Senior Lead Office (SLO) in 2008 in basic car 8A53 which is the area surrounding WLA station. He moved to the Pico/Robertson area in 2016, moving back to WLA to take over the SLO position for Brentwood from Maria Gray when she retired in 2020. He plans to say on as Brentwood's SLO until he retires in August of 2030 which will be after 30 years of service. On his days off he enjoys spending time with his wife and two teenage daughters. He also enjoys surfing and mountain biking.



Bryan Kirkness, MPA
Chief Inspector,

Bryan Kirkness is a Chief Inspector working for the Los Angeles Housing Department's Code Enforcement Division. He has done it all in the Los Angeles Housing Department:

Systematic inspection, Complaint responses, Urgent Repair Program, Emergency Management responses, Tier II/Task Force, Residential Hotels and Tenant Habitability Plan.

Since he joined the Department in 2006, he has steadily risen from his first job as Assistant Inspector to directing one of the largest housing departments in the country.

Bryan received a Bachelor of Science (BS) Public Administration from University of La Verne and a Master of Public Administration (MPA) from California State University-Northridge. His vast knowledge of housing makes him uniquely qualified to discuss how our community can keep itself safe even in a major earthquake zone.

Traci ParkCouncilwoman, District 11,
City of Los Angeles

Councilwoman Traci Park had a successful 20-year legal career as a municipal attorney before being elected to the LA City Council, representing the 11th District. Park was the first person in her family to attend

college, earning degrees at Johns Hopkins University and Loyola Law School. Like many of her constituents, she worked two jobs and borrowed heavily to finance her education.

She doesn't come from a political background and that fact certainly helped her to get elected, running against the endorsed view of the Homeless crisis as a housing issue. Park has criticized the "housing first" strategy of combating homelessness, and wants to instead increase investment in recovery housing and shared housing that focus on a culture of treatment and sobriety. She also wants to enforce L.A.'s anti-camping law, saying encampments near schools are "non-negotiable." Certainly, the VA homeless crisis in Brentwood was one of the main focuses of her election campaign.

Recently, Park introduced a Motion to reassess how homeless funds are distributed in LA county. "Los Angeles voters repeatedly have shown their commitment to financial measures that aim to reduce homelessness," Park has said, "But with the mental health and addiction on our streets worse than ever, it's clear we need to reassess how these funds are allocated."



Jared RiveraCity Deputy Mayor

Deputy Mayor Jared Rivera was born in California's Central Valley, before moving with his family to Southern California's Inland Empire at the age of five. He earned a bachelor's degree in social welfare at UC Berkeley.

Upon graduation, Rivera began his career as a community organizer with the PICO National Network (now Faith in Action). During eight years with PICO, Rivera worked to expand affordable housing in Los Angeles and led efforts to promote immigration reform and citizenship across the city.

In 2010, Rivera joined Service Employees International Union (SEIU), a union of about 2 million diverse members in healthcare, the public sector and property services. He coordinated the union's efforts toward comprehensive immigration reform by organizing press conferences, citizenship workshops and "know your rights" training across the state. In 2017, he became the political director of SEIU Local 2015, California's largest local union.

In June of 2023, Mayor Karen Bass named Rivera Deputy Mayor of Community Engagement. His job is to lead community engagement, develop strategic partnerships and ensure high-quality constituent service.

Homelessness Report by Barbara Roll

The City of Los Angeles continues to experience a large population of unhoused persons. Brentwood residents have taken on the issue of homelessness in the local area, corralling the efforts of partners in the community that are focused on dealing with those unsheltered.

The City of LA through Council District 11 has deployed a CARE/CARE+ approach:

"Comprehensive Cleaning & Rapid Engagement" provides cleaning or "sweeps" of encampments, where People Experiencing Homelessness are asked by law enforcement to temporarily remove their tents and belongings while sanitation workers sweep, power wash and remove trash and hazardous materials from the area. Outreach workers accompany the sweep and offer supportive services to these people.

The following are just some of the areas where the CARE/CARE+ process has impacted encampments:

- Barrington/Darlington
- Santa Monica/Bundy Triangle
- Westgate
- Bringham/San Vicente outside the Veterans Administration property

Here is a sampling of what residents may look forward to on new programs and legislation addressing the issues surrounding homelessness.

CARE Courts/Community Assistance, Recovery and Empowerment Courts New program, initiated by Gov Newsom and expected to launch in LA County December 2023 (per vote of the LA County Board of Supervisors), which is aimed at helping Californians who are suffering mental health and substance use disorders leading to homelessness. RV Regulation - Introduction of a motion by Councilwoman Traci Park, seeking to regulate RV parking around schools, daycare centers, parks and homes. This would limit where RV's can be parked in residential areas and create designated areas where they can be parked.

The City Council voted 12-0, approving a motion seeking to amend city law to add RV's to the list of vehicles that cannot be used for housing. Other legislative actions include a "van lord" motion, which seeks to prohibit the sale and leasing of RVs on public streets.

The Veterans Administration Greater Los Angeles extends their reach to the unhoused Veterans.

- There are currently 233 total permanent supportive housing units available on the West LA Medical Center north campus for homeless and at-risk Veterans and their families, through Enhanced Use Leases.
- Over the next two years, 374 units of new housing are expected to open on the West LA north campus.
 Construction is underway for Buildings 402,404, 401A,156 and 157 with completion set for late 2023/early 2025.

The VA is working with the contracting office as well as potential patterns to scope out beautification projects and improvements across the West LA VA Medical Center, including the area by the Eisenhower Gate.

A message from our LAPD Senior Lead Officer Matt Kirk

Brentwood has experienced a 25% decrease in part one crime this year compared to the same time in 2022. In every crime category, we had a decrease in crime with 11% being the

lowest decrease in crime. For Brentwood to continue with these low crime rates, we must all make efforts to make the area more difficult for the criminals to be successful. I have listed simple crime prevention tips in these categories.

Burglary (down 39%)

- Lock up all doors and windows when you leave home. Also lock side gates to the yard area and any storage sheds on property.
- Leave lights and a television or radio on if possible.
 If you are away for an extended vacation,
 make arrangements to have mail, packages and
 newspapers collected. Also ask a trusted neighbor to keep an eye on your home while you're gone.
- Keep your house well-lit, particularly around entrances. Add extra lighting around with motion detectors around entrances and dark corners of your home.
- If possible, consider getting a security system. If you have a system, make sure it is always in good working order and checked regularly. Make sure security cameras are properly working and the recording is saved for at least 30 days. Also, be able to access footage if needed.
- If you have a video doorbell, be sure to respond when someone comes to your door, whether or not you're home. Burglars often check to see if anyone is home before breaking in.
- Photograph your valuables in their locations around your home and make a list of the make, model, and serial numbers. Photograph important documents and keep them in a safe deposit box. If you have a safe, make sure it is secured to the ground to prevent removal.

Grand Theft Auto (down 30%) / Burglary Theft from motor vehicle (down 11%)

- Always lock and secure your vehicle.
- Never leave any personal property in plain sight. If you must leave valuables in the vehicle, keep locked inside the trunk or hide in the vehicle.
- Never leave the key fob inside the vehicle. If you
 live in a building with tandem parking, never leave
 keys inside the vehicle or on top of the tire for ease of
 moving vehicles.
- Always make sure the second set of keys is in a secure location.
- If you have a Prius, investigate getting a security plate to prevent the catalytic converters from being stolen. Also, if possible, park in a secured garage.

Theft (down 23%)

- If you live in a building, make sure delivered packages are secured in a locked closet prior to pick up. If you are unable to have packages locked in a secure mail room, make sure they are picked up prior to the next day. Many package thefts from buildings occur between midnight and 5:00 a.m.
- Those that live in single-family residences, make sure packages are picked up ASAP. Try and schedule deliveries on days you know you will be home
- Whenever shopping at the store, make sure purses are being worn to the front and never left in the shopping cart. Theft crews often work in pairs. One suspect will engage in small talk while the second suspect will grab the wallet out of the purse. Many times, by the time the victim notices the wallet is gone, the suspects have already made charges on the card in a very short period.

Transportation Report by Lauren Cole

SBRA is monitoring projects impacting traffic in South Brentwood including:

- Sepulveda Transit Corridor Six alternatives for heavy rail (subway) or monorail through the Sepulveda pass from Van Nuys to the Expo (E) Line are under consideration. Target completion is 2033 2035 with a future Phase 2 to LAX by 2054-55. Most alternatives are east of the 405 so would not directly impact our area. https://www.metro.net/projects/sepulvedacorridor/#status
- Wilshire Purple Line (Line D) The Westwood and VA stations are slated to open in 2027. SBRA is concerned about how people will access these given that no parking lots are planned and our area is already gridlocked during evening peak hours. We will try to work with Metro, the VA, and CD11 on solutions. https://www.metro.net/projects/westside/
- Congestion Pricing/"Traffic Reduction" Study A task force at Metro is studying whether to recommend tolls on all lanes of the I-10 freeway west of the I-405 during peak hours. SBRA is concerned that this would force additional traffic onto our streets. Metro has scheduled a series of meetings beginning October 24 to announce their plans. Please see https://www.metro.net/projects/trafficreduction/#latest-updates for more information.
- STAP (Sidewalk and Transit Amenities Program) Bureau of Street Services is replacing bus shelters on Wilshire Blvd. with new shelters with digital rotating ads. SBRA requested that STAP keep brightness at low levels and that ads not shine into residences along Wilshire. https://streetsla.lacity.org/stap-program-fact-sheet
- FilmLA/Film Permitting SBRA is in discussions with CD11 (Council Office), FilmLA, and other Brentwood HOAs to see whether a default rule can be established to park large production vehicles such as Star Waggons along the golf course on the south side of San Vicente. Also, we feel no permits should be given near the Farmers Market for Sundays, which happened in August.
- Additional parking for Farmers Market SBRA explored whether parking guidelines could be relaxed on the north side of San Vicente during the Farmers Market to allow for legal parking, but learned that safety issues prevent this from happening. Farmers Market attendees who drive should continue parking along the golf course (San Vicente and Montana) and in the surrounding neighborhoods where available. Parking illegally in conflict with the posted street signs is subject to ticketing.
