**ASSAULT:** 1

11900 Wilshire Blvd.

On 12/04/16 at 0830, the victim demanded that a trespass suspect leave. Suspect spit on victim and then picked up a stick and hit his victim several times.

On 11/14/16 at 1030, unknown suspect(s) contacted elderly victim and convinced her that her granddaughter was detained in jail and needed bond money. Victim wired \$55,000.00 to the suspects.

12000 Wilshire Blvd.

On 11/25/16 at 2100, the suspect (Male, Black, 25-30 years old) entered rear of business and removed a backpack, watch and headphones all valued at \$951.00

11800 Wilshire Blvd.

On 11/26/16 at 0100, victim went to the club's restroom and when she returned her purse and wallet and currency was missing, valued at \$2,500.00

11900 San Vicente

On 11/28/16 at 0830, unknown suspect(s) opened valet key box and took vehicle keys.

200 S. Barrington

On 11/28/16 at 1330, unknown suspect(s) signed the Fed Ex delivery form when a computer was delivered. Victim never received the computer, valued at \$1,500.00

1200 Getty Center

On 12/01/16 at 1540, unknown suspect(s) removed an Ipad valued at \$400.00 from a conference table.

11600 San Vicente

On 12/01/16 at 2045, victim went to the establishment's bathroom and when she returned her wallet and tablet were missing, valued at \$1,267.00

11700 Chenault St

On 12/02/16 at 1015, two suspects (Male, Hispanic and Male, Unknown) scaled fence and stole delivered packages off of porch valued at \$600.00

12000 Goshen Ave

Between 12/02/16 and 12/03/16, the suspect (Female, White in her 20's) met the victim in a bar. When victim awoke at his residence the next morning his Rolex watch valued \$9,000.00

**Note:**

The days of having your packages delivered to your door stop are over. Of course, if you choose to, you can continue to take the chance of porch deliveries because of the understandable convenience. But if you value your delivery, then you must make the appropriate changes and take new measures to ensure you that you actually receive it.

And why I say that door stop/porch deliveries are over is because there are roving teams of people who follow delivery trucks and scoop up the deliveries.

They do this every day, all day long, particularly during the holidays, and typically during the day when most folks are at work. They'll take anything that's not nailed down. They'll teach their kids to do go get the packages. And when it's not an organized effort, it's simply a crime of opportunity. It's sitting right there, within plain sight. And equally important, be aware of the message that a package sitting at your door sends out: there's a package/packages on the front door stop and so likely NO ONE IS HOME. It's such an easy crime to master, with little risk of getting caught and typically a very minor penalty.

So have a plan:

Require someone to sign for the package and if no one is home to sign for it, it will be automatically held for you at the shipper's facility until you can get there.

Have your packages delivered to your work place, or delivered to a neighbor who is willing and able and always home. Or have it delivered to a retired relative.

Have it tracked.

You can have it delivered to the local store branch closest to you and then pick it up at your convenience.

Request a specific delivery date and time from the shipper when you know you will be home.

Provide deliver instructions to the shipper so that the packages can be placed in a safe location at your home that is out of sight from the street.

Sign up for delivery alerts (emails or texts) and then if need be, have a trustworthy neighbor walk over and pick it up until you get home.

Amazon.com offers 'Amazon Lockers' which delivers your package to a secure site at a local convenience store, like a 7-11. Brentwood has Amazon Lockers at the 7-11 at 11656 Wilshire as well as on the UCLA campus. To find the Amazon Locker closest to you, go the Amazon.com website and search 'locker locations'.
