## **WEST LOS ANGELES DAILY CRIME BRIEFING BASIC CAR 8A13 November 20, 2015 through December 07, 2015**

### **ROBBERY: 0**

Westgate/Wilshire Blvd 12/04/15, at 2200, two suspects approached the victim and began punching the victim. During the assault, victim lost his right shoe. One suspect picked up the shoe and fled with it. Shoe valued at \$70.00

### **ASSAULT OR ADW (Assault with a Deadly Weapon): 1**

Mayfield/Granville (Attempt Rape) 11/29/15, 0600, the victim was collecting cans when she was grabbed able to run away. Suspect described as a Male, Hispanic, 5/7", 200 lbs, in his 30's, dark skin.

### **BURGLARY: 6**

800 Westgate (multi-complex unit) 11/26/15, between 0800 and 1830, unknown suspect(s) entered apartment through unlocked sliding door. Suspect(s) fled with victim's property valued at \$2,000.00  
11700 Sunset Blvd (multi-complex unit) Between 11/30/15 at 1000 and 12/01/15 at 1700, unknown suspect(s) entered victim's secured apartment by unknown means and fled with an envelope of cash she had hidden in her closet. A \$4,000.00 loss

11800 Wilshire Blvd (commercial/restaurant) 12/01/15 between 0155 and 1005, unknown suspect(s) used pry tool to gain access to rear door. Suspects fled with cash and sporting tickets valued at \$10,000.00

11900 Wilshire Blvd (commercial/dispensary) 12/10/15 at 0300, A witness called police and said they heard noise coming from one of the commercial businesses on Wilshire. As police were arriving, they saw two males, unknown descent, fleeing from the location from where the call was generated. Unfortunately, suspects were able to flee the location. Unknown property was stolen.

11900 Wilshire Blvd (commercial/restaurant) 12/10/15 at 0300, (related to the above incident), suspects smashed business window and stole \$500.00 in cash from register.

11300 Burnham (residential) 12/10/15 between 1830 and 2030, unknown suspect(s) entered an unlocked side gate and then pried the door into the residence. Suspects fled with victim's property: Swagways and Ipad valued at \$1,200.00

**BFMV (Burglary and/or Theft from Motor Vehicle): 11**

1300 S. Bundy Between 11/25/15 1900 and 11/26/15 at 0830, unknown suspect(s) entered subterranean garage, smashed window, removed property and fled.

3300 Mandeville Canyon Between 11/29/15 and 11/30/15 at 0800, unknown suspect(s) stole items from unlocked vehicle valued at \$1,000.00

Between 12/06/15 at 2300 and 12/07/15 at 0230, unknown suspect(s) removed all four of the BMW vehicle tires/rims valued at \$3,000.00 and placed vehicle on bricks.

13500 Bayliss Between 12/07/15 at 0005 and 12/08/15 at 2355, unknown suspect(s) entered vehicle and stole binoculars valued at \$200.00

2000 Mandeville On 12/08/15 at 0455, suspect (Male, White, young and clean cut accompanied by another Male, White suspect who stole items from a vehicle across the street) opened vehicle door and ransacked inside of vehicle. No property taken.

11900 Mayfield On 12/09/15 at 0520, unknown suspect(s) entered the victim's unlocked vehicle and fled with a gym bag valued at \$20.00.

11600 Dunstan Way Between 12/09/15 at 1930 and 12/10/15 at 0800, unknown suspect(s) gained entry into victim's secured vehicle and fled with sunglasses valued at \$400.00

**GRAND THEFT & PETTY THEFT: 11**

11900 Mayfield (residence) Between 11/13/05 and 11/21/15, Victim was in the process of moving. Unknown suspect removed computer desktop valued at \$2,500.00

11400 Sunset (commercial location) Between 11/15/15 at 1400 and 11/16/15 at 1720, victim had left her necklace in an unlocked hotel safe and checked out. Upon her return home she realized she left her necklace but it was no longer in the safe. Necklace valued at \$65,000.00

11700 Kiowa (residence) On 11/23/15, unknown suspect(s) stole grill from front of victim's doorstep.  
12000 Goshen (multi-unit complex staircase) Between 11/27/15 and 11/28/15, unknown suspect(s) cut the lock and fled with victim's bike valued at \$430.00

11800 Darlington (multi-unit complex) Between 11/29/15 at 2100 and 11/30/15 at 0730, unknown suspect(s) gained access to underground parking and removed BMW vehicle tires and rims valued at \$5,200.00

11900 Sunset On 12/01/15 at 1215, two suspects described as Male, Hispanic (no further description) cut the lock off the back of a pick-up truck and stole a lawn mover, leaf blower and weed whacker, all valued together at \$ 2,600.00

11700 Kiowa Between 12/04/15 at 1100 and 12/07/15 at 2100, unknown suspect(s) removed lug nuts from 2014 BMW in an effort to steal tires/rims.

200 26th Street (commercial) On 12/06/15 at 1310, suspects entered store and grabbed multiple purses and fled with victim's property valued at \$25,840. Suspects described as two Female, Blacks, thin builds, late 20's.

1100 Barry (multi-unit complex garage) On 12/07/15, between 0200 and 0500, unknown suspect(s) entered garage and stole a bicycle valued at 500.00

11800 Kiowa (residence) On 12/07/15, between 1700 and 2000, unknown suspect(s) stole Mercedes vehicle wheels valued at \$3,000.00

100 Barrington (commercial) On 12/09/15, at 1125, suspects described as three Female, Blacks, entered store and stole purses that employee had been showing them valued at \$\$11,000.00. Suspects ran off with merchandise and were seen meeting up with another suspect described as Male, Black

**Note from Officer Gray:**

I have received multiple e-mails in recent weeks from residents living in the Mandeville Canyon/Westridge/Bayliss vicinity advising me that they've had items stolen from within their vehicles.

**Please be aware that sending me an e-mail about an incident does not constitute 'reporting' it. It is very important that folks properly report an incident when they've experienced a theft or break-in.**

**Although it may feel like a pointless hassle, reporting a vehicle break-in is quite important. This is because every morning, our command staff and detectives meet to determine where the crime is occurring and where to allocate resources. And they determine this by looking at the number of crime reports generated in any particular area and making note of any growing crime spikes or trends. Without a proper police report, they will not fully know the extent of what's going on and consequently, police cars will be assigned to the more problematic areas of our division.**

**Depending on the circumstances, they may be reported over the phone. A good number to have is our West LA front desk at 310-444-0702 or come by the station at 1663 Butler Ave (one block south of Santa Monica Blvd).**

**Keep in mind that the desk gets quite busy in the afternoons/early evenings and since we are open 24/7, you may want to make your contact around the busiest times.**

And do please continue to send me the e-mails. I very much appreciate the effort that some take to share something with me that was discussed on Nextdoor.com or other observations/conversations that otherwise I wouldn't know about (just remember that the email is not an actual report ☺)

Also of recent note is the number of vehicle tires/rims stolen from BMWs and Mercedes in recent weeks, particularly in multi-unit complex garages. If you own this type of vehicle, please be aware and make an effort to park in a highly visible location. In my opinion, ALL subterranean garages should have adequate lighting and surveillance cameras and signs that advise thieves that they are being watched.

Thieves do their 'shopping' this time of year as well. Don't ruin your holidays by leaving anything behind or visible in your vehicles and consequently suffering a break-in and loss.

The other crime trend of note are the two shoplifting incidents that occurred at commercial boutiques of high end purses by suspects described as young (late 20s), Female, Blacks.
