



Western Screech Owl is a small owl native to North and Central America, closely related to the European scops owl. Length averages 22 cm, wingspan 55 cm, and weight 143 g. Color: grayish, brownish, or reddish-brown (rufous). The upper parts are flecked with white; the breast and belly are pale with dark, spidery streaks. The face is pale, outlined with dark arcs.



Great Horned Owl: large, thick-bodied owls with two prominent feathered tufts on the head; wings are broad and rounded. In flight, the rounded head and short bill combine to create a blunt-headed silhouette; mottled gray-brown, with reddish brown faces and a neat white patch on the throat. Length 46–63 cm, wingspan 101–145 cm, weight 910–2500 g
