A GUIDE FOR OWNERS of PROPERTY ALONG KENTER CREEK*

If you are considering building, remodeling or re-landscaping your property, be sure you know the Do's and Don'ts!

Los Angeles Municipal Code section 64.07, 64.08, 64.09 and 64.10 requires that any work performed in or near the creek receives a watercourse permit from W.L.A. Bureau of Engineering. In addition, property owners should obtain a 1602 Streambed Alteration Agreement from the California Dept. of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW). An Erosion Control Plan and SWPPP (Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan) will also be required during the demolition phase and construction phase. Please contact the W.L.A Bureau of Engineering, the L.A. Dept. of Building and Safety (LADBS) and City of Santa Monica Dept. of Public Works for more information/permits.

California Department of Fish and Wildlife - responsible for conserving, protecting, and managing California's fish, wildlife, and native plant resources. *This includes any potential modification to a river, stream, or lake; requires plans and permits for work near the Creek.* (916) 445-0411

Los Angeles & Santa Monica Dept. of Public Works and Los Angeles Dept. of Building & Safety - responsible for Storm Water Pollution Prevention, illegal dumping, and erosion. ***Requires plans, permits and required setbacks for any work near the Creek.***

The Tree Protection Code protects and regulates removal of protected trees and the LA County Oak Tree Ordinance protects certain native species of specific sizes.
